

## MRS BLAKER'S BOOK CLUB


If you have read the books from my book club, we will be meeting on **Monday 15th April**.

# What we are learning this week

#### Reception

Last week we loved our new story 'The Naughty Bus.' The children could not believe the Naughty Bus trashed the classroom and they loved writing their wanted posters to try and catch it. They had to use adjectives in their writing to describe the bus. Some children chose to draw a picture of it so that they knew what to look for. In art we had our second session of painting to music for the mind and body. They used various different tools and colours of their choice. In maths we carry on exploring teen numbers and making them in different ways using manipulatives. The children also had a blast in our Matzah Baking workshop!

#### Year 1

English- This week we wrote our own tale based on the story of the tortoise and the hare. We came up with interesting sentence openers, fabulous describing words for the animals and the settings and we made sure our tale has a happy ending and a moral. Maths- This week we focused on capacity and volume (the maximum amount that something can contain). We used the language full, nearly full, nearly empty and half empty to describe and compare volumes.

Art- We finally finished our class 3D sculpture! We worked together to create a giant spider sculpture. We decided to display it on the wall in our classroom!

#### Year 2

This week we had a fantastic matzah-baking session... you may have heard the fire alarm!

The baker discussed the story of Pesach with the children and reminded them why we eat matzah on this occasion. The children had lots of fun making their dough, rolling it out and stamping holes in it, before leaving it to the professional to put it in the oven! In Maths this week, we have been learning about volume and capacity and we have practised measuring liquids using litres and millilitres.

In English, we have been learning about the features of an explanation text.

In Science, we have been thinking about what healthy and unhealthy plants look like and we learnt what pollination is and how this plays a part in producing new plant seeds.

#### Year 3

This week in Maths, Year 3 have learned about unit fractions and beginning to compare and order them.

This week in English, Year 3 have finished planning, writing and editing their own kenning poems.

On Thursday, Year 3 went to Epping Forest to learn and explore different types of rocks and soils. They all had a great time with a massive thank you to our parent helpers.

#### Year 4

Year 4 have had a fun filled week! We have created our chassis in D&T and are thoroughly looking forward to producing the end result so we can see who has the fastest slingshot car!

In English we have been working very hard to up level our vocabulary using thesaurus' when creating expanded noun phrases and in Maths we have almost completed our Fractions unit.

#### Year 5

We have had an exciting week in Year 5! On Tuesday Norwood charity visited us to tell us all about the fantastic work they do in the community and we learnt about different disabilities. We also did some matzah baking as well ahead of Seder! In English, we have started writing our own mystery texts whilst in Maths we have been learning about decimals, percentages and fractions. Finally, in DT we have started designing our own pop-up books, which we will be reading to and present to reception later on this year!

#### Year 6

In Year 6 we have been starting our big write, where we are writing a speech to encourage parents to evacuate their children during World War II. We had a Norwood workshop and learnt about Autism Awareness Day. Furthermore, we created our own spirit companion and used watercolours to decorate our designs. This week, we had our last session with Watford FC Positive Minds Programme.



## This week in Ivrit

Reception: We learnt the word 'achshav' (now). The children introduced themselves as different characters using different character pictures on lolly sticks and saying 'achshav ani...'.

Year 1: We learnt the letter Resh (7) as in the word Robot.

Year 4: We further developed our speaking skills with the topic 'Ha'mishpacha sheli' ('my family'). The children introduced the family members in ivrit using the words 'ze', 'zot', and the new word 'shei' (mine)

Year 5: We further developed our reading skills this week. The children read two and three-syllable words with all the vowels and played the four-in-a-row game in two groups.

Year 6: We further developed our speaking skills this week with the topic 'Eyfo ani gar' ('where I live') from the programme Ivrit B'click. The children learnt the word 'leyad' (next to), and the Ivrit words for different places (e.g. park, supermarket etc.).

### This week in Jewish Studies

Year 3: We talked about the main events of the Passover story, practiced the Ma Nishtana (the 4 questions) and acted out the crossing of the Red Sea.

Year 4: We looked at the role of Moses in the story of Passover and made 10 plagues posters.

Year 5: We discussed the different foods we eat on Passover and their symbolic meanings and designed a board game with questions related to the subject.

Year 6: We had fun baking at the Matzah factory.
