Year 6 will go home in their play outfit on Tuesday 9th July after our production, then wear them to the evening performance on Wednesday 10th July. # What we are learning this week

**Reception:** We have had a brilliant week learning about different countries. A highlight was learning about Greece where we learnt about structures and practiced balancing on our own structures. We really enjoyed baking pizza when we learnt about Italy - it was yummy! The children did so well in their sports day races and we are really proud of how they persevered. Next week we are learning through the text 'We are Going on a Bear Hunt.'

Year 1: We had such busy week full of fun sports activities, voting and learning.

English- This week we have been working with a partner to sequence our explanation text. We discussed the difference between facts and opinions and looked at facts about how to stay healthy.

Maths- We finished our topic about place value and all the children showed great understanding of the concept (tens and ones within 100). We have started to learn about coins and money.

Music- We have been learning about low and high pitch and used the glockenspiels to identify high and low notes. We also started to learn how to play 'You are my sunshine'.

Science - We observed our seeds and recorded the changes that have happened. All of the seeds have sprouted and some have long roots and a short stem.

**Year 2:** We've had so much fun doing our Sports Week activities this week. The children got to have a go at Gaelic football and boxing (no children were harmed in the process of this session!) and they also had to complete a very punishing circuit that included burpees, star jumps, shoulder taps and squat jumps. They also had a workshop about the physical and mental health benefits of participating in sport.

In Maths, we finished our unit on time, using the 5 times table to help tell the time to the nearest 5 minutes. We also learnt that the hands go round an analogue clock twice each day as there are 24 hours in a day.

In English, the children wrote their own rhyming poems based on The End by A A Milne and they performed them for the rest of the class.

In History, we learnt about what a coronation is and we discussed the four different parts of the ceremony: the oath, the anointing, the investing and the crowning.

On Thursday, the children got to take part in the Clore election. They looked at the Year 5 parties' manifestos and decided which had the policies they most agreed with. Then they filled in their ballot papers and posted them in the ballot box. This sparked lots of important and interesting conversations about the General Election and how votes are cast.

**Year 3:** This week in Maths, Year 3 have been learning about units of time and have started their new topic on shapes. This week in English, Year 3 have been starting to learn about Tanka poems and have learnt actions to Tanka poem text map. This week for sports week, Year 3 have really enjoyed all their activities including Gaelic football and boxing sessions.

**Year 4:** Year 4 have had a busy sports week! We thoroughly enjoyed the rugby and boxing workshops. In Maths, we have begun our new unit of shape and have been trying to remember Not to Eat Shredded Wheat as a way of memorising north, east, south and west to help explain position and direction of turns. Additionally, we have been looking at obtuse, acute and right angles. In English, we have been reading the story Meesha makes Friends and have been discussing the themes around this story. In Art, we have looked at William Morris' designs and we will be collecting different items on our school trip to Kenworth next week to help with our final Art project!

Year 5: We've had another busy week in Year 5 this week! On Tuesday, we spent our break times trying to persuade voters to vote for our respective political parties, ahead of Thursday's Clore Shalom general election. We also had Lisa from the Blue Cross Charity visit us and talk to us about how pets can help our wellbeing. In English, we planned and wrote our own playscripts, whilst in Maths we converted between imperial and metric units of measurement.

**Year 6**: This week, we have been rehearsing our play in the hall and we are excited to share our performances next week! Also, we have made our own props for the play in Art and Design. We have studied the history of evolution in Science and created our own surveys in Computing. This week, we have finished Pig Heart Boy by Malorie Blackman, which we highly recommend Year 5 read next year!



# This Week in Jewish Studies

In Y1 we talked about Shabbat and the reasons we celebrate it. We completed an activity of setting up the Shabbat table and learned to make braided Challah.

In Y2 we talked about how Jacob was deceived by his uncle. We spoke about the importance of being patient and how we get rewarded if we learn to master the skill.

In Y3 we talked about the different blessings over the food. We practiced saying them and had a fun activity sorting food according to each blessing.

In Y4 we discussed the importance of the mitzvah of caring for the environment. We made posters to hang around the school to remember to recycle, switch off the lights and reuse supply.

Y5 finished the power points and slideshows about a famous Jewish person they chose to present to the class.

Y6 had a fun last JS session with Kahoot! Games and quizzes about the people they chose to research about.

## This Week in Ivrit

Reception: This week we learnt the words 'yeled' (boy) and 'yalda' (girl). The children picked a photo of one member of the class and put it in the correct gender hoop whilst saying '\_\_\_\_ yeled/yalda'. We also decorated cardboard girls and boys and said the new words in Ivrit. The children created 3-word sentences using the new words combined with the verbs 'omer' and 'omeret' and learnt phrases.

- Year 2: We continued to practice reading two-syllable words with the vowels 'Ah', 'Eh' and 'O' through interactive and card games.
- Year 3: We continued to practice reading two-syllable words with the vowels 'Ah', 'Eh', 'O', 'Ee' and 'Oo' through interactive and card games.
- Year 4: We continued to practice writing script letters. The children challenged themselves by converting words from block to script.
- Year 5: We continued to practice writing script letters. The children wrote words in script on mini whiteboards in groups, and competed to be the table who wrote the most correctly.
- Year 6: We played different games using vocabulary we have learnt throughout the year. The children also competed to write as many lvrit words as they could before the 5-minute timer ran out.
