What we are learning this week

Reception:

What a fantastic start to our last half term in Reception. We enjoyed exploring the text 'Here We Are' by Oliver Jeffers. We talked a lot about protecting our earth and keeping ourselves and the animals safe. We particularly focussed on birds and we loved making our own bird feeders. The children enjoyed observing their feeders each day to see if their seeds had been eaten. In maths we have been focussing on positional language and the children enjoyed exploring our brand new bee bots where they got to programme them to move in different directions. In art we learnt some new threading skills which helps to develop their fine motor. Next week we are learning about Under the Sea and this will carry on for two weeks. We will also be making cheese cake for Shavuot!

Year 1:

English- Our current topic is 'Recounts' and our model text is based on the Gingerbread man story. We learnt the text map and used drama to retell the recount. We also identified features of a recount (first person, past tense, chronological order and time words).

Maths- This week we have been learning about quarters. We found quarters of shapes and amounts.

Art- We have been learning about primary and secondary colours.

Geography- We compared Jerusalem to our local area. We looked at similarities and differences between the physical features (nature) and human features).

Year 2:

We have had a productive and fun week in Year 2.

In Maths, the children have been collecting information and recording it in tally charts and tables. They have then been using these tables to analyse the data and make comparisons.

In English, we have been learning about the features of non-chronological reports, focusing on our model text about polar bears. The children have also been learning about the simple present tense and have been using it to write about their daily routine. We are continuing our unit about coasts in Geography, and the children used Google Earth to explore the Jurassic coast. They looked closely at Weymouth and identified the human and physical features they saw there.

In Art, the children loved working with clay and they learnt how to roll it, shape it and make marks in it.

We were lucky enough to have a representative from Perform drama group come and run a fantastic drama session with the children, based around the theme of fairytales. The children (and I!) had a great time pretending to be all different characters and helping save fairytale forest from the wicked Red Queen!

Year 3:

This week in Maths, Year 3 have finished off learning about fractions and have started to learn about money. This week in English, Year 3 have been learning about pronouns and rhetorical questions.

In Computing, Year 3 have been learning to code using the Microbits to make their own name badges.

Year 4:

Year 4 have worked extremely hard this week practicing for their class assembly which went fantastically on Wednesday! We have also been working very hard on our times tables for our multiplication check.

In maths we have been focusing on partitioning, ordering and comparing decimals. In English we have been writing our letters to persuade Mrs Blaker to replace teachers with celebrities and robots. In Geography we have created our own diagrams of the water cycle.

Year 5:

In English, we have finished editing our explanation texts and have now started learning about playscripts! In Maths, we have been learning about coordinates and translating shapes. Finally, in History we have been investigating the impact the Vikings had upon communities in Britain ahead of our exciting trip to St Albans Cathedral next week!

Year 6:

This week, we have started a maths project about planning a journey around the world. We have picked a destination, converted km into miles and compared prices for flights from different UK airports. In English, we have been focusing on building tension using clips and extracts from The Life of Pi and Hary Potter and the Prisoner of Azkaban as inspiration. We had a workshop by Keshet UK on the power of words: reducing the use of hurtful language.

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This week in lvrit

Reception:

We created sentences using the verb omer/omeret ('to say' in masculine and feminine form) using all the learnt phrases. The children remembered that in lvrit we read from left to write when using the visual cards to create the sentences.

Year 1:

We practiced writing some of the Hebrew letters.

Year 2:

We learnt to read one and two-syllable words with the vowels 'Ah' and 'Eh'. The children enjoyed reading these in pairs.

Year 3:

We learnt to read one and two-syllable words with the vowels 'Ah' and 'Eh'. The children enjoyed reading these in pairs.

Year 4:

We practiced reading words with the vowel 'Oo' and the children worked on improving their speaking skills. We also started to learn script letters from alef-yud.

Year 5:

We practiced writing the letters alef-yud in script. The children enjoyed writing rewriting words containing these letters from block to script.

Year 6:

We started learning about the new topic food and drink from the programme lvrit B'click, focussing on speaking skills. The children learnt new food vocabulary and the verb ochel/ochelet/ochlim/ochlot ('to eat' in masculine, feminine and plural forms). We created sentences using the new vocabulary.

This week in Jewish Studies

Reception:

This term, we started learning about the stories in the Bible. This week the children learnt about the story of Adam and Eve. We watched a short video and had a class discussion about the story. The children enjoyed creating a snake from paper plates and glue.

Year 1:

We had fun learning about Shavuot with a bingo game using Shavuot symbols.

Year 2:

We talked about Ruth and Naomi's friendship. We drew a comic strip to describe how Ruth followed Naomi back to Israel to help and support her.

Year 3:

In Y3 we learnt about the Ten Commandments. We had a discussion about which ones are important to us and had a challenge to complete a jigsaw puzzle with an important commandment.

Year 4:

We watched a video about Moses climbing Mount Sinai and discussed the importance of the Ten Commandments. We also made an Origami Ten Commandments.

Year 5:

We discussed the reasons why we read the book of Ruth on Shavuot. We watched a video about Ruth and Naomi and put the story sequence in the correct order.

Year 6:

We read a short version of the book of Ruth and learnt the connection between Ruth and King David. We concluded the lesson with a word puzzle with name and words related to the story.


YEARS 5 & 6
