We have been focusing this week on World Book Day by discussing the many benefits of reading.

You may feel that I 'go on' about reading a lot, but that isn't just because I love it. I'm very lucky that something I love happens to be so beneficial! After keeping children safe, the single most important thing that primary schools can do for children is enable them to read. It improves their educational outcomes right into secondary school, across the entire curriculum, not just English. It improves their life chances by supporting resilience, emotional intelligence and broadening horizons. It supports wellbeing by offering an easily accessible means of relaxation. It is the one measure that improves all childrens' life chances, whatever their family background. Parents often ask me what they can do to most benefit their children, and after giving their unconditional love I always say, encourage them to read. My own children know that books are the one thing I will buy for them without complaining! I would encourage you to visit the library this weekend, or use your World Book Day token to buy one of the free books available to all children. I am always available to discuss ways of encouraging children to read if any parent would like that discussion.






MRS BLAKER'S BOOK CLUB

Join Betty as she tries to solve the mystery and keep on gardening!







Year 1

Next Wednesday (13th March), we will design and create our own musical instrument.

Please can you send in with your child, any junk modelling that you have at home (small boxes, straws, cardboard tubes, bottle tops, yogurt pots, etc.). Please can you make sure that whatever you send in is washed and clean.

Please make sure you listen to your child read during the week and sign their reading record.

Year 2

Please continue to read regularly with your child at home and send their reading folders in every day. The spelling quiz is set on Puprle Mash and there are times tables set on TTRS.

Year 3

Please continue to read with your child every day and make a note in their reading records. Purple mash spelling quizzes are set and ready to access, these link to the spelling words we learn for that week.

Year 6

On Thursday 14th March, Year 6 will be investigating the effect of heart rate when exercising. Therefore, Year 6 can come into school with their PE kits and it would be ideal if they have a smart watch to measure their heart rate too.



What we are learning this week

Reception

This week we have enjoyed exploring the text 'Grandad's Island' by Benji Davis. We enjoyed talking about different special people in our lives. Some children drew them and also drew where they lived. In maths we have continued to learn about number bonds and doubling numbers using hands on resources such as numicon. In art we loved splatting paint to make fireworks to continue our learning about abstract art. We have been doing some shared writing for book week where the teachers model how to write a story.

Year 1

Maths- We have been learning about counting from 20 to 50. We focused on counting by making groups of tens. For example: There are 20 ones in 20. There are 2 tens in 20.

We also looked at numbers with tens and ones. For example: There are 3 tens and 6 ones. The number is 36.

English- We wrote our own set of instructions, edit and reflected our work. We know all the features we need to include in order to write a good set of instructions. We made sure we had a title, a list of 'you will need', time words, bossy verbs and clear and specific instructions. Some of us also included adverbs (carefully, slowly, gently...).

Science- We looked and discussed changes between seasons (winter to spring).

History- We have been learning about Ibn Battuta and his achievements.

Year 2

This week in Maths we learnt how to measure in centimetres and metres and then looked at comparing objects with different lengths and heights.

In English, we innovated our class free verse poem and then the children used all their knowledge about the features of free verse poems to compose their own.

In History, we thought about sources of information and how we can use them to learn more about seaside holidays in the recent past. We focused on photographs and discussed how useful they are in providing information about past events.

In Science, we continued our learning about plants. We looked at the life cycle of a broad bean plant and discussed all the different stages: seed, germination, mature plant, flower, fruit. We also checked on the broad bean seeds we planted in pots in the classroom. The children were delighted to find that a couple of them have already germinated!

Year 3

In Maths this week, Year 3 have been learning about measuring lengths using millimetres, centimetres and metres. In English this week, Year 3 have started their new topic of non-chronological reports by learning actions to our story map about the Earth.

Year 4

This week year 4 have been storytellers! We were given the challenge to use six props to write a story for World Book Day. We thoroughly enjoyed this, as we came up with some fantastic ideas! We have also begun our new topic of Fractions in Maths. We are looking forward to STEM week next week.

Year 5

In English for World Book Day, we wrote 5 sentences based on different objects that the teacher brought in; we had an eggcellent time writing our story! In Maths, we learnt about multiplying: non-unit fractions, unit fractions and mixed numbers. Finally, in Art we learnt about how to make decisions when creating pieces of art.

Year 6

This week, we have started to use the micro:bits as part of our coding unit and have started to make our sourdough starters. We will be exploring this further next week during STEM week and cannot wait for our parents to taste our sourdough bread. In Maths, we have finished our unit on percentages, fractions and decimals and have now moved onto learning about area, perimeter and volume. In English, we have been studying the features of an effective biography.



This week in Ivrit

Year 1: We recapped all the letters we have been learning so far.

Year 2: This week we focused on reading with the vowel 'Eh'. The children played noughts and crosses with different levels: the first was one-syllable sounds with the vowel 'Eh'. The second was two-syllable sounds with the vowels 'Eh' and 'Ah'.

Year 3: The children designed a poster with 7 different greetings in Ivrit. They matched the pictures to the correct written greeting and some of the children challenged themselves to write the Ivrit greetings themselves.

Year 4: This week we learnt the words 'ze' ('this is' for male) and 'zot' ('this is' for female). The children introduced different family members using these words.

Year 5: This week we practiced reading different lvrit letters using all the vowels. We started a new topic of 'where we live' from the programme 'ivrit b'click'. We also learnt the verb 'gar' in masculine, feminine, and plural forms. The children created sentences using the new verbs combined with their classmates' names.

Year 6: This week, we started a new topic of 'where we live' from the programme 'ivrit b'click'. The children watched a short video about this topic and were asked comprehension questions about the video to check their understanding. We also learnt the verb 'gar' in masculine, feminine, and plural forms. The children created sentences using the new verbs combined with their classmates' names.

This week in Jewish Studies

Reception: We continued to learn about the story of Noah's Ark. The children enjoyed learning the song 'the animals went two by two' and created a puppet using lolly sticks and animal masks. The children also built an ark with wooden bricks.

- Year 1: We had fun activities related to the book of Genesis. We made bookmarks and a 3D Noah's ark.
- Year 2: We discussed why we have a Mezuzah on our doors and made clay Mezuzot.
- Year 3: We talked about the meaning of lighting the Shabbat candles and made candle holders.
- Year 4: We split into teams and each team had a challenge of writing a short skit related to a main event in the story of Esther.
- Year 5: We constructed the time line of King David's life in the right order using information cards.
- Year 6: We read and discussed the events of the Ten Plagues.
