What we are learning this week

Reception:

This week we have continued learning about Mini Beasts. The children have enjoyed using describing words to write about their mini beasts. They have been looking at mini beasts in bug viewers and have enjoyed identifying them. In D and T this week we have been planning how to make out boats to test out. Next week we will be using a range of materials to make them. In maths we have been learning about 2d shapes and on Friday we are staring to learn about sharing and grouping. Next week we will be learning all about Seeds.

Year 1:

Yesterday we celebrated our Chagigat Ha'Siddur. Thank you for coming and being part of this special occasion. Well done Year 1 for a fabulous presentation.

Flourish- In our Flourish lessons, we are learning about money and jobs as part of the topic, Economic Wellbeing. If any parents or family members have any interesting jobs that they would like to come and talk to Year 1 for a few minutes about, we would love to welcome you in. You would share a little about what you do and the children will ask you some questions about it. Please speak to Mrs Jacobs or Mrs Lax to arrange a time.

English – Our current topic is shape poems. We looked at different shape poems and learnt a star shape poem. This week we have been learning about alliterations and similes. Alliteration is the repetition of the same sound at the start of a series of words (big blue balloon, fantastic phonics, Donald Duck). A simile describes something by comparing it to something else, using 'like' or 'as' (slow like a snail, quick as a flash, big as a house, bright like a star). Maths- Last week we practised how to count in 2s, 5s and 10s. This week we have been learning about equal and unequal groups. Example: There are 3 bags. Each bag has 2 apples. How many apple are altogether? 2+2+2= 3

Year 2:

This week in Maths, we have been learning about fractions. We started by recognising quarters and halves and then we moved on to finding a half or a quarter of an amount.

In English, we are continuing to use Meerkat Mail as a model text to help us with recount writing. We started by learning the story map and then acted out scenes from the story. Then, the children learnt the features of a recount, which include writing in the first person, using past tense verbs and sequencing events in chronological order. In Science, we discussed the meaning of the word habitat and then explored different examples of habitats. We then thought about why certain animals are suited to certain habitats.

In Music, we are exploring the sounds of the British Isles by learning folk songs associated with the city, coast and countryside. This week, the children learnt 'My Bonnie Lies over the Ocean' and then had fun creating soundscapes of the seaside using just their voices and bodies.

Year 3:

In Maths this week, Year 3 have been learning about Mass, focusing on scales, grams and kilograms. In English this week, Year 3 have been learning about using similes to add more detail and dialogue to progress a story.

In Science, we did an experiment looking at friction by testing different surfaces.

Year 4:

Year 4 have thoroughly enjoyed working on their free verses this week in English. We have been very creative thinking of different onomatopoeia to include in them. We have also been working very hard on decimals in Maths. We continue to learn about Ancient Egyptians in History and Sound in Science.

Year 5:

In Maths this week we started our new topic all to do with shapes! The children have started to learn about different types of angles and how to measure accurately using a protractor. We have begun to learn about explanation texts by identifying the features of one and used relative clauses to explain as well. In PSHE we have been looking at health and wellbeing, specifically how yoga can help with our mental health and help us keep calm.

Year 6

This week, Year 6 have been revising in English and Maths. We have recapped our arithmetic, reasoning and problem solving in Maths. In English, we have recapped using colons, semi-colons and dashes for parenthesis. In Science, we produced a line graph showing how our data exercise effects heart rate. Furthermore, in Music we have been learning to harmonise The White Cliffs of Dover with a counter-melody.




This week in Ivrit


Reception: We recapped the learnt vocabulary and learnt the verb 'omer' (to say). We built 3 word sentences with visual cards using learnt phrases.

This week in Ivrit, we focussed on Yom Ha'atzmaut festival which is next week.

Year 4, 5 and 6 learnt the meaning of 'Hatikva' which is Israel's national anthem. We watched a video and sang it together. The children also wrote it out, and some children challenged themselves by writing it in script. We also played interactive games where the children put the words of the song in the correct order.









This week in Jewish Studies

Reception - started to learn about 'Yom Ha'atzmaut', Israel's Independence Day. We learnt that Israel is going to celebrate their 76th year. The children looked at the flag of Israel and designed their own flag using glue, blue coloured paper and other items.

- Y3 we looked at some key symbols of Israel and recognised them on old Yom Haatzmaut posters.
- Y4 learned facts about Israel anthem Hatikvah and practiced singing it.
- Y4 learned to recognise the location of Israel on the world map and the countries surrounding it.
- Y5 discussed the importance of Israel to the Jewish people and looked at a map of Israel and the location of the main cities of the country.
