What we are learning this week

Reception

We have had such a fun week learning about houses and homes. We explored the text of The Three Little Pigs and story mapped all the main events. We made our own houses and tested to see if we could blow them down. In phonics we have been moving through the sounds and they are becoming a little trickier. We have practised lots of oral blending. In maths we have been working on mathematical language and enjoyed a game of balancing the bean bag.

Year 1

English- We have been using lots of adjectives to describe things that we can see, hear, smell, feel and taste during the autumn season. We also changed our senses poem as a class and wrote it in our books.

Maths- we have been learning about one more/one less and ordering values from smallest to biggest.

Geography- We have been learning how to understand a map and how to use it to get around.

Year 2

In English this week we have been learning about the features of an instruction text – if a stone giant is ever on the loose in Shenley, Year 2 will know how to catch it!

In Maths, we have been representing numbers in different ways using a variety of manipulatives and then putting the numbers in order. We have also been learning how to compare numbers using the >, < and = symbols.

In Science we did an experiment to compare the properties of objects made from different metals and found out that not all metals have the properties.

Year 3

This week in Maths, we have been learning how to add 2 digit and 3 digit numbers using regrouping of the ones and tens. This week in English, we have started our new topic of newspaper reports. Learning the text map, acting out reports as news presenters and finding the features of a newspaper.

Year 3 had their amazing Stone Age Workshop on Monday this week. They all learned so much and looked amazing in their costumes!

Year 4

We have had a busy week in Year 4. In Maths we have been solving subtraction sums and even challenged ourselves to find missing digits in a subtraction sum. We have also been practicing the 4 times table song to 'Shake it off' which the children are enjoying learning. In English we have been researching information about the sun and space and have started to plan and write our own poems using alliteration and metaphors. In Science we continued to look at animal habitats and researched why there are a number of endangered animals and what the causes are of this.

Year 5

We have been learning about prime numbers and composite numbers. Prime numbers are numbers which only have two factors whereas composite have more than two factors. We have been looking at reasons why refugees might come to the UK as part of our 'Journeys' history topic. Finally, in English we have been rehearsing our talk 4 writing poster all about the 'Adventures of Isabel', please ask one of us to recite it for you!

Year 6

In Year 6, we have been learning about recount texts and using Traction Man by Mini Grey as inspiration for our own writing. During maths, we have learnt about short division. In Science, we have produced an investigation into the respiration of yeast!



This week in lvrit

Reception: We learnt about 'Simchat torah''. We also practiced introducing ourselves by saying the word 'Ani' (I'm) followed by our name and saying to each other 'Boker- tov' and 'Shalom'.

Year 1: We recapped the learnt letters and learnt the letter Vav (I). We also looked at books in lvrit and identified familiar letters.

Year 2: We recapped the letters that look alike and all the different letters that sound the same. The children matched the letters to their English sounds through different activities.

Year 3: We practised reading two/three syllable words that contain the vowel 'Aa' and 'Eh' in pairs.

Year 4: We practised reading one/two syllable words with the vowel 'Aa' and 'Eh' and 'O' and wrote them on mini whiteboards.

Year 5: We read one/two/three syllable words with the vowel 'Ee' and matched them with their English sounds. The children were tasked with finding and highlighting words the teacher called out loud within the text and practised writing them in script letters.

Year 6: We read one/two/three syllable words with the vowel 'Ee' and matched them with their English sounds. Some children challenged themselves and practised writing them in script letters.



NURTURE

This week, our focus has been on use of language within social situations. The children were very animated in their acting of skills and were keen to suggest alternatives when things went wrong. Equally, they were looking at the reasons behind what people might mean when they say something and how it might be misinterpreted, which proved to be a very interesting discussion.

Our session was also on World Mental Health Day, and we talked about the importance of checking in with our feelings and talking to others about how we feel.
