We look forward to welcoming parents to parents' evening over the next two weeks. Please note that Year 6 children may attend their consultation if they would like. Please make every effort to check and keep to your appointment time. You are welcome to look at your child's work in the classroom. We have recently made changes to our marking policy and you should now see the following coding in books:

Pink highlighting of a learning objective means it has been met. Excellent examples of work are also highlighted in pink.

Green highlighting of a learning objective means it has not been met. Issues for correction are also highlighted in green.

Key spelling errors are highlighted in yellow and corrected by the children in blue pen.

Please remember that teachers are constantly circulating round the class and giving children feedback in real time. We do not write long comments on books because evidence shows us that children do not read them or act on them. We are not carrying out English and Maths conferencing any more as we felt that it was ineffective. Just because a book is not heavily marked, please do not assume it has not been looked at. The great majority of feedback to children is verbal.

#### Year 6



Join Betty as she tries to solve the mystery and keep on gardening!





#### What we are learning this week

#### Reception

This week we have enjoyed STEM week where we have been carrying out new experiments each day. We enjoyed asking and answering how and why questions and the children were very engaged in all their learning. A favourite activity was making our Blow Rockets which the children enjoyed sharing with you all. We loved our bubble making workshop, thank you to our parent helpers. In maths we continue to look and learn about 3d shapes and their properties. In phonics we are practising our reading, learning new sounds and handwriting them. Next week we are learning about Zog and the Flying doctors.

#### Year 1

English- We have been learning the story of the Tortoise and the Hare. We used actions, drama and props to retell the story. We also identified features of traditional tales. Features for example: animal as characters, interesting sentence openers, special places such as woods or a castle, good vs bad, happy ending and a moral. Next week we will look at interesting sentence openers and character description.

Maths- We completed the topic 'Place value' (numbers up to 50). We looked at number line to 50, estimated numbers on a number line by finding the halfway first and found 1 more/less. Next week we will look at measuring and height.

STEM week – We have had exciting lessons about our senses. We carried out tests to find out more about our five senses. We also recorded our results on a spreadsheet and designed our own musical instrument. We took part in a Bubbles workshop and had a chance to explore bubbles, their shape, properties, and colours. We also sorted out different tools for making bubbles.

Thank you parents helpers for supporting the children during the workshop. We could not do it without you.

#### Year 2

We have had a really fun, informative and engaging STEM week in Year 2. Our Science topic is plants and the children got the opportunity (when the rain finally stopped!) to go outside with magnifying glasses to have a look at the trees on the field. We discussed the things they observed that surprised or excited them and they were really thrilled that they were able to see flower buds just beginning to emerge. In another lesson, we examined different seeds and bulbs to find similarities and differences and then we measured them to compare their lengths. The children recorded their results in a bar graph and analysed their findings. They then made information leaflets on Purple Mash about the life cycle of plants, bringing together all their learning from the week. We definitely have some budding scientists, mathematicians and technologists among us. We finished off a fab week with a POP as we had a fun bubble workshop! The children explored the colours, shapes and sizes of bubbles they could make with different objects. Thank you to the parent volunteers who came to help.

This week in Maths, we have been looking at odd and even numbers. We have also been using the ten times table to do multiplication and division calculations and thinking about how the two operations are linked.

In PSHE, we thought about what helps calm us when we feel stressed or nervous. The children practised some breathing exercises so they have some tools to calm themselves down if they need them.

#### Year 3

In Maths this week, Year 3 have been learning about equivalent lengths. How millimetres, centimetres and metres all link.

In English this week, Year 3 have been researching a country to write a non-chronological report. They have also learned about fronted adverbials and conjunctions to compare and contrast.

#### Year 4

Year 4 have had a very exciting STEM week! We made t-shirts to show the different parts of the digestive system, we had a fantastic workshop where we made masks of Roman God's out of plastazote, but the most fun we had was making POO!

Yes, you read that correctly, POO! Although don't fear, it was pretend poo. We mashed bananas, bread, orange juice and water together and fed them through tights to replicate intestines as part of the digestive system. We are quite the scientists!

We also wanted to say a huge thank you to our parent helpers who did a brilliant job during our workshop.

#### Year 5

In Year 5 this week we created our own animal top trump cards, linked to our science topic: All Living Things and Their Habitats. We started the week by effectively searching online using technology to find out information about animals, which answered questions we had about them – linking to our science learning too. After this, we looked at the work of Francis Barlow (Britain's first ever wildlife painter!) and used his work as inspiration for our own animal designs. Finally, we used our Maths skills to read tables and produce graphs based on the results.

#### Year 6

As part of STEM Week, we have enjoyed a 3D printing workshop on Wednesday, where we designed a 3D house using Tinkercad.com. In Coding for STEM Week, we made our own code for the micro:bits to design a step counter and a star jump tracker. We also would like to thank Mrs Blaker and Mrs Levenson for helping us to make our sourdough bread, which we cannot wait for you to try! In English, we have also started our big write, which is a biography about Anne Frank. In maths, we have been learning about area and perimeter of triangles and parallelograms.

#### This week in Ivrit

Reception: The children learnt the phrase 'Purim sameach', which means 'happy Purim'.

This week we focused on reading skills. Each class received a booklet with different fun activities using all the learnt vowels. The children worked independently within their own ability.

- Year 1: We have been learning the letter Tzadi / Tzasik as in the words Tzedaka and Matza.
- Year 2: Using the booklets, the children practiced reading one, two, and three-syllable words with the vowels 'Ah' and 'Eh'.
- Year 3: Using the booklets, the children practiced reading one, two, and three-syllable words with the vowels 'Ah', 'Eh' and shvah (the sound of the letter).
- Year 4: Using the booklets, the children practiced reading one, two, and three-syllable words with the vowels 'Ah', 'Eh', shvah (the sound of the letter), and 'Ee'.
- Year 5: Using the booklets, the children practiced reading one, two, and three-syllable words with the vowels 'Ah', 'Eh', shvah (the sound of the letter), 'Ee', and 'O'.
- Year 6: Using the booklets, the children practiced reading one, two, and three-syllable words with the vowels 'Ah', 'Eh', shvah (the sound of the letter), 'Ee', 'O' and 'Oo'.

#### This week in Jewish Studies

Reception: We talked about Noah and did an activity related to the animals that went into the Ark.

- Year 1: We talked about the main events in the story of Esther and made masks.
- Year 2: We learned the meaning of the first line of the Shema and practiced writing the words in the same style it is written in the Torah.
- Year 3: We matched the Shabbat symbols with their definitions and practiced the Shabbat blessings.
- Year 4: We discussed the four mitzvot of Purim and made a poster with pictures representing each mitzvah.
- Year 5: We learned about King Solomon through different activities. We had a go building the holy temple with Lego pieces, wrote an acrostic poem using a fact sheet and illustrated the story of the judgment of King Solomon.
- Year 6: We imagined the effect of the Ten Plagues from the perspective of different characters in the story of Passover writing about the experience as a diary entry.
