## **Snow Plans**

The colder weather has prompted us to think about our plans for snow. Obviously we do everything possible to keep our school open, but very occasionally bad weather and dangerous travel means that we are not able to open. Please note the following points:

- We will always do everything possible to keep school open but we also need to consider staff safety and adult:child ratios.
- In the rare event of school closure we will make every effort to notify parents in a timely fashion by text and by email. If weather makes travel during the day dangerous, we will close school early and will notify parents by text and email.
- In the event of snow but the school remaining open, a team of staff and parent volunteers will assemble early to clear safe paths and grit them. If you would like to volunteer to be in this group, please email the school office so that we can start a Whatsapp group.
- In the event of snow and the school remaining open, we will give children every opportunity to play outside safely. Please ensure they have suitable cold weather clothing, and younger children may want to bring a change of socks or tracksuit bottoms.





It is quite common for children to have minor head bumps when they are playing in school. We have an obligation to tell you when this happens, but we are also aware that we can sometimes cause worry by calling home during the day. We have decided in the case of minor headbumps to send parents a standard email which should give you all the details you need without causing worry. The email will read:

Dear Parent

We are letting you know that your child had a minor head bump in school today. Time: Location: He/She is now absolutely fine, and there is no cause for concern, but we are happy to speak to you further about it if you would like to call us.

Please rest assured that in the case of more serious injury we will call you and communicate fully.

I hope that this simplifies things and reduces worry and time spent by receiving an unexpected call from school.


Reception and Year 1: Chino loves to play with her mother's sleeping scarf. Join her and her family as she uses her imagination to bring the scarf to life.

### What we are learning this week

#### Reception



This week we have had one of our favourite weeks of the year- 'Nursery Rhyme Week.' We have explored rhyme, participated in lots of singing and role play involving our brand-new bakery. We held an investigation as someone pushed Humpty off the wall- who did it? In phonics we continue to revisit sounds, practise the formation and practise blending with Fred. In maths this week we have explore pattern, subitising and lots of counting songs. We can't wait for People Who help Us Week.

#### Year 1

Maths – this week we compared numbers to 10 and used symbols and comparisons language such as greater than, less than and equal to (> < =).

English- we finished writing our poems and we learnt how to edit and review our work. We used blue pens (for the first time) to edit and improve our writing.

History- We looked at homes and homes items from the 1950's and 1960's and we compared them to our own homes. We discussed similarities and differences.

Science – We used all our knowledge about materials to carry out a simple test. We designed boats (that float) for a marble. We thought carefully which materials to use and if they float or sink, absorb water or waterproof.

#### Year 2

In Maths this week, we have been recapping number bonds to 10 and using this knowledge to help with our number bonds to 20. We have also been looking at fact families, using part/whole models and bar models.

In English, the children have been writing their own stories that include recurring language. They thought of their own characters and objects to use in their story and then made sure they included lots of writing features, such as time adverbials, adjectives and, for a challenge, similes.

In Art, we used the maps the children drew in a previous lesson as inspiration for making stained glass windows. We then combined all the windows to make one, giant piece of Year 2 art!

In History, we have been thinking about why we still celebrate Bonfire Night - is it to remember the historical event of the Gunpowder Plot, or is it just to have fun? Thank you so much to the parents who shared their memories of Bonfire Night with us, they sparked some interesting discussions.

#### Year 3

This week in Maths, Year 3 have been learning about ordering and comparing numbers to 1000 using more than and less than symbols.

This week in English, Year 3 have been learning about play scripts using our text map and finding the features of a play script. This week in Science, Year 3 have been learning about mirrors and reflections.

#### Year 4

In Year 4 this week we have been learning all about Roman Numerals and even challenging ourselves with very high numbers, using our knowledge on place value to help us solve these.

In English we have written some fantastic non-chronological reports about Ogres and we spent time imagining what their hobbies, appearance and habitat might look like.

In Science, we carried out an experiment to test whether different materials melt at the same temperature. We used chocolate, ice cream, butter, ice and a candle and carried out a fair test. The children predicted and wrote up a conclusion.

#### Year 5

Year 5 had a recycling workshop and participated in interfaith week as part of our very busy week! We built rockets as part of an online science workshop and we learnt about the different forces a rocket interacts with when launching and the features of a rocket. In English we wrote our remembrance day poems and in Maths, we were looking at place value up to one million.

#### Year 6

We have started learning about fractions in Maths. During English, we wrote our non-chronological reports about Ancient Greece.In Science, we have investigated and explained how light travels.



#### This week in Ivrit

Reception: The children introduced themselves by saying 'Ani' followed by their name and introduced the vocabulary of Male 'Ata' and Female 'At' with their classmates.

Year 1: We learnt the letter Kaf.

Year 2: We learnt the vowel 'Ah" and practiced reading all the lvrit letters in order with the vowel 'Ah'.

Year 3: We practiced reading letters/words in lvrit containing the vowel 'O'. Using one and two syllable words to challenge themselves.

Year 4: We read one/two syllable words that contain the vowel 'Ee' in pairs and played interactive games. We also played a game with all the lvrit letters and learnt vowels.

Year 5: Using one/two syllable words that contain the vowel 'Ee' and the children played interactive games. They learnt to pronounce and sound the vowel by matching it on a worksheet.

Year 6: We read one/two syllable words that contain the vowel 'Ee' and played interactive games. Some of the children designed a poster and wrote about themselves and their family using script letters.

#### This week in **JS**

In Reception, we are learning about the first day of creation, on the first day G-D created the light and separated the light for from the darkness.

They watched a short video for day one of creation and say why we need the light and dark. On a paper plate they separated night and day using black and yellow cards.

In Y1 we talked about the benefits of friendship (two are better than one) in the Jewish tradition.

Y2 created Jacob's ladder in 3D after we learned about his dream and the promises that G-d made to him.

Y3 continued to talk about Mitzvot. We all wrote good deed challenges and put them in a jar. We took turns picking a challenge and discussed how we are going to fulfil them.

In Y4 we added 3 more words from the birkat hamazon prayer and played musical chairs to practice reading them.

In Y5 we learned that there are eight levels of Tzedakah. We begun the lesson with a challrnge to put the levels in order and then learned the differences between them and the importance of the eight level.

Y6 we briefly discussed the term Tikun Olam which means repairing the world before we split into groups and went to do chores around the school which included helping teachers with learning materials and other tasks, sorting out the playground in early years and organising the reception area. Then we reflected on how it made us and the recipients feel.

# NURTURE

We read a gorgeous book called 'My Body Sends a Signal' by Natalia Maguire, which focussed on what happens to the body when experiencing different feelings. This prompted lots of questions about how we are similar to and different from each other. The children understood the importance of learning to recognise their signals so that they can learn to control their reactions to the emotions.

Next week we will be exploring different strategies that help us regulate our emotions. Please help the children to notice these themselves throughout this week so they are ready to talk about them in next week's session.
