Class Reminders

Year 6:

This week in JS

Reception: We learned about the bible story "Joseph and the multi-coloured coat". After watching a video, we discussed the story. We've created and designed Joseph's multi-coloured coat using PVC glue, different coloured cards and paint.

This week in **Y1** we talked about the 5th commandment of respecting our parents. We made a list of ways to show our appreciations and made father and mother's cards.

In **Y2** we talked about Sarah. We wrote speech bubbles of conversations between Abraham, Sarah and the three visitors and had a joke challenge to help us remember Sarah's laughter.

In **Y3** we practiced reciting Birkkat Hamazon, Benching. We also talked about why we pray and wrote our own special prayer.

In **Y4** we reviewed the Ten Commandments and the importance of respecting the elderly. We wrote parent poems. For the remainder of the year both **Y5** and **Y6** are going to research and make a presentation about ten important Jewish leaders in politics arts and science. This week the children researched their chosen leader and decided on how to make their presentation.

This week in Ivrit

Year 2: We practiced reading two-syllable words with the vowels 'Ah' 'Eh' and 'O'.

Year 3: We practiced reading two and three-syllable words with the vowels 'Ah', 'Eh', 'O', 'Ee' and 'oo'. We also further developed our speaking skills with the topic 'Ha'mishpacha sheli' ('my family'), the children introduced the family members in ivrit using the words 'ze', 'zot'.

Year 4: We further developed our speaking skills with the topic 'Misparim' ('numbers'). we also practiced reading two and three-syllable words with the vowels 'Ah', 'Eh', 'O', 'Ee' and 'OO'.

Year 5: We further developed our reading skills this week, the children read two and three-syllable words with all the vowels and played the four-in-a-row game in two groups. We also practiced writing the Ivrit letters in script writing.

Year 6: We practised writing the Ivrit letters in script writing, and we further developed our reading skills this week, the children read two and three-syllable words with all the vowels and played the four-in-a-row game in two groups.

What we are learning this week

Reception:

We had the most wonderful trip to Barnet Environmental Centre on Thursday. The children had a fabulous time pond dipping, catching mini beats with nets and collecting flowers. All the Reception children were so well behaved and we would like to say a HUGE thank you to all our parent helpers too, we couldn't have done it without you!

At the beginning of the week, the children read the story 'Bog Baby' and the children made their own Bog babies and named them. Some children made homes for them too! For their Art lesson, the children learnt how to join different materials in different ways using different techniques, such as sewing, flange, tape, brace, tie, fold and sticking.

Next week we will be continuing our topic about 'under the sea' and we will read the story 'Dougals Deep Sea Diary.' The children will be writing their own diaries. In maths the children will be recapping their knowledge of doubles and subtraction. In Art the children will be making their own paper snakes using the skill of folding and in English they will be creating dioramas of under the sea, inspired by the book 'Sharing a shell'.

Year 1:

We had such an exciting week! We had the best time at Barnet Environmental Centre. We enjoyed catching insects with nets, pond dipping and finding frogs, lizards, worms and many other creatures that live in shaded areas. Thank you to all parent volunteers for helping to make this trip fun for the children.

This week we also had our class assembly! We hope you enjoyed our show and learnt more about what we have been learning this year. Well done Year 1! You were amazing! Thank you, parents, for supporting and helping your children to learn their lines and perform with confidence.

Maths- We have started our new topic "positions and directions". We have been learning about turns- quarter turn, half turn, three quarter turn and a full turn. We also explored describing directions of movement. For example: "The circle moved to the right/left," "The circle is to the left/right of the triangle".

English- We sequenced photos from our school trip and put them in chronological order. We planned and wrote a recount about our school trip. We remembered to use first person, past tense and time words.

Art- This week we looked at a Jasper Johns' art and created a piece of art like his. We used all three primary colours to paint and created secondary colours. We have lots of talented artists in Year 1!

Year 2:

The highlight of the week for Year 2 was obviously our day out to Hertfordshire Zoo. We had a really fun and educational day, which included two very informative, interactive workshops linking to our 'living things and their habitats' Science unit, we had time to see all of the animals and we even fitted in a trip to the adventure playground! Thanks to our parent volunteers for helping to make it a really memorable day for the children.

In Maths, we learnt how to draw pictograms and how to interpret information in pictograms. We also began our unit on telling the time, starting with exploring o clock and half past the hour.

In English, the children planned and boxed up their own non-chronological reports, using our model text about polar bears as a guide. They then wrote their report out in full, remembering to include the features we had learnt about: simple present tense, formal language and subheadings.

In Geography the children identified physical and human features in the local area of Shenley.

Year 3:

In English we have been revising verbs, prepositions, expanded noun phrases and fronted adverbials to make our writing even better. In Maths we have been telling the time. In History we learnt which of the ancient Egyptian beliefs were the most significant. In Science we made a magnet game and in Art we are learning about positive and negative space in sculpture. In PHSE we are learning about stereotypes.

Year 4:

In Maths we have begun our new unit of Money and have been converting, comparing and estimating amounts of money. In Science we made string telephones.

Year 6:

Some of Year 6 have enjoyed cycling proficiency this week. For English and Maths, we are making brochures to persuade readers to purchase our holiday packages! In Science, we have been learning about adaptation and we looked at pictures of the biological parents of Nellie (Mrs Surey's dog) and estimated the characteristics she inherited from them. We were pretty spot on with our predictions!
