We look forward to welcoming parents to parents' evening over the next two weeks. Please note that Year 6 children may attend their consultation if they would like. We have recently made changes to our marking policy and you should now see the following coding in books:

Pink highlighting of a learning objective means it has been met. Excellent examples of work are also highlighted in pink.

Green highlighting of a learning objective means it has not been met. Issues for correction are also highlighted in green.

Key spelling errors are highlighted in yellow and corrected by the children in blue pen.

Please remember that teachers are constantly circulating round the class and giving children feedback in real time. We do not write long comments on books because evidence shows us that children do not read them or act on them. We are not carrying out English and Maths conferencing any more as we felt that it was ineffective. Just because a book is not heavily marked, please do not assume it has not been looked at. The great majority of feedback to children is verbal.

## What we are learning this week

#### Reception

This week we have really enjoyed learning about Zog and the Flying doctors. The children enjoyed writing some captions and drawing some pictures of Princess Pearl Trapped in the castle. A favourite lesson was our new D and T unit where we investigated waterproof materials. We had to test different materials in water to see which ones repelled or absorbed the water. We enjoyed creating our own musical performances in music. In maths we continue to lean about patterns and more complex patterns. In phonics we continue to learn and revise sounds, practise reading and handwriting.

#### Year 1

English- We have been learning how to start a story in an interring way. We came up with fantastic sentence openers such us 'One dark night...' and One spring morning...'.

We also describes the characters in the story using adjectives and the conjunction 'and'.

Maths- This week we focused on measuring length and height. We used non-standard (cubes and paperclips) and standard units of measurements (rulers).

#### Year 2

This week in English, we have been looking at calligram poems. Calligrams are poems that create a shape that links to the topic of the poem.

In Maths, we have been learning that mass means weight and that we can measure mass in grams. The children compared objects and decided which one was heavier or lighter or if they had equal mass.

In Science, we set up our new experiment to test what plants need to grow and stay healthy. The children predicted that they will need light, water and soil and in two weeks, we are going to see if they were right!

In History, we discussed what makes a holiday souvenir valuable and what souvenirs can tell us about seaside holidays in the recent past.

#### Year 3

In Maths this week, Year 3 have been learning about comparing and adding lengths. In English this week, Year 3 have been writing and editing their own non-chronological reports about a country they selected.

#### Year 4

This week year 4 have been working hard on fractions. We have been looking at equivalent fractions where Mrs Khan cut up her tie! This was to represent the idea of a whole, a half, a quarter and an eighth.

We have also thoroughly enjoyed reading The True Story of the Three Little pigs as part of our Narrative unit in English and modelling how water flows using foil tins and compost in Geography.

#### Year 5

This week in Year 5 we showed off the fantastic work we have done so far this year with an excellent Year 5 Assembly performance! In Maths, we've been looked at fractions and decimals, specifically tenths, hundredths and thousandths. In English, we illustrated and described a mystery setting. Finally in Art, we created calligraph prints and then drew some space inspired art work on our fantastic creations.

#### Year 6

This week, we have had a 2 day Anne Frank workshop and on Friday we had an incredible day with plenty of activities for Purim. In Maths, we have started to look at statistics, including reading bar graphs, pie charts and line graphs. Also, we have finished writing our Anne Frank biography and started our new English unit on persuasion.





## This week in Ivrit

This week in Ivrit, we focussed on the festival of Purim. We watched a powerpoint presentation about all the characters from the Megillah, what we eat during Purim, what we do during the festival, and why we celebrate it. We had a great week with lots of fun activities including arts and crafts and games.

Reception: We learnt the word 'laytzan' which means 'clown'. The children also learnt the song 'laytzan katan sheli' (my little clown), and sang and danced together.

Year 2: We learnt the words 'melech' and 'malkah' which mean 'king' and 'queen'. The children designed crowns and wrote these words on them in lvrit.

Year 3: The children created puppets of all the characters from the Megillah on Iolly sticks, and acted out the story using their puppets.

Year 4: The children created and decorated a clown ('laytzan') face, and labelled each part of the face in ivrit ('af', 'peh', 'ayin', 'rosh', 'ozen').

Year 5: We learnt vocabulary relating to Purim. The children wrote all the characters from the Megillah in Ivrit and completed a wordsearch with all the Purim vocabulary.

Year 6: We learnt vocabulary relating to Purim by playing a wordwall game. The children wrote all the characters from the Megillah in Ivrit and completed a wordsearch with all the Purim vocabulary.

## This week in Jewish Studies



Reception: We retold the story of Esther from the Megillah and identified all the characters from the story. We also learnt that when we hear the name 'Haman' in the Megillah, we shake the gragger and make noise. The children made their own graggers from plastic bottles filled with pasta, rice and beans, decorated them with stickers, and learnt to say it in lvrit: 'ra'ashan'.

Year 1: We reviewed the story of Purim and had fun making clowns.

Year 2: We discussed the main events in the story of Purim and made a king and queen puppets.

Year 3: We talked about the main characters in the Purim Megillah and made posters representing each character.

Year 4: We presented the 4 Mitzvot posters that we made last week to the other classes and had a challenge of putting the Purim story events in order.

Year 5: We watched a video about Purim, discussed the role of the two guards who plotted to kill the king and enjoyed writing jokes based on Purim related symbols.

Year 6: We had a not too hard quiz about lots of details in the story of Purim and had fun games including hang man and Purim Pictionary.
