This is a 4-week parenting programme designed for parents of secondary school students aged 11-18, who are neurodivergent or have neurodivergent disabilities. The programme aim is to ease the transition from childhood to adolescence, by encouraging positive parenting and relationship building.

Disaster Diaries The Worst Show Ever by Joanna Nadin


What can you do if you desperately want to buy a saxophone, but you don't have the money? Find out how a group of friends are determined to win a prize and make their dreams of fame come true.
