

Chanukah Mishpacha

Pencil Cases

Pencil cases and writing equipment are becoming rather elaborate and we have had several children either distracted by interesting pen toppers/rubbers or distressed when they lose them. This ensures children focus on their work and not on their writing equipment and it also means that parents are not pressured to buy expensive or gimmicky stationery because others have it in the class. 
